

NEW ENGLAND RECORDS.

Six Broken, Two Equalled, and Two Established in A. A. U. Events.

BOSTON, June 28.—Six New England amateur records were broken, two were equalled, and two more established today by the athletes competing in the annual championship track and field meeting of the New England Association of Amateur Athletic Union on Technology Field. Athletes representing the Boston Athletic Association were responsible for seven of ten record performances.

As the track upon which the running events were contested is a comparatively slow one, some of the times recorded were considered remarkable. James A. Power of the Boston A. A. won the mile in 4:19 2-5, defeating Oscar F. Hedlund, a prominent clubmate.

Thomas J. Halpin of the same club raced 440 yards, with two turns, in 0:49 for another new mark. W. H. Mannix, also of the Boston A. A., won the 220-yard low hurdles in the new record time of 0:25 2-5. The other three records were broken in field events. J. O. Johnstone of the Boston A. A. leaped to a new height in the high jump, reaching 6 feet 1½ inches, and K. W. Torrey of Bedford vaulted 11 feet 7½ inches in the pole vault. The broad jump of Lincoln F. Prescott of Phillips-Andover of 23 feet 6½ inches was a surprise.

Existing records were equalled by Howard P. Drew of Springfield in the 100-yard dash and by J. A. High of the Boston A. A. in the 120-yard hurdles. The marks made in the discus and javelin events stand as records, these being new events on the programme.

One of the most keenly contested races of the afternoon was the half mile, which Eugene T. Marceau of the Boston A. A. won in 1:57 3-5.

A. S. Robinson, the Mercersburg schoolboy, who performed spectacularly earlier in the season, was able to secure only second place in the 220-yard dash, which was won by I. T. Howe of Boston English High School in 0:22 1-5. The summary:
